Knowledge and understanding of the past events, people and changes in the past.	The Victorian era (1837-1901)	The Victorian era' describes the time during which Queen Victoria reigned in Britain (1837-1901).	
	Queen Victoria	Queen Victoria was only 18 years old when she became Queen and she ruled Britain for 64 years .	
	Poor children	Worked long hours in factories, mills, coal mines, or as chimney sweeps. Lived in damp, dirty conditions. Many children died of disease. Most did not go to school. Toys were handmade.	
	Rich children	Children did not work. Lived in big houses, often with servants. Went on holidays. Were taught at home. Had expensive toys.	
	Victorian schools	Children had to pay to go to school. There could be as many as 60 - 80 children in a class.	
	Teachers and lessons	Victorian teachers were very strict. Typical lessons involved the 'three R's' - Reading, wRiting and aRithmetric (maths). Sometimes pupils did 'drill' in the classroom (exercise). Children were often taught by reading and copying things down, or chanting things until they were perfect.




