

Year One Curriculum Overview

Summer 1: Robots



English

The children will read stories with Fantasy settings and learning poems of by heart

The children will learn to:

- Identify and discuss the main events and characters in stories.
- Give opinions and support with reasons.
- Demonstrate understanding of texts by answering question related to who, what, where, when and why.
- Write simple sentences that can be read by others.
- Use capital letters, full stops and question marks.
- Identify and begin to use exclamation marks.
- Use simple connectives to link ideas.
- Sequence events in order.

Physical Education

Athletics

The children will further develop their underarm throw and sore skills.

Science, Geography, D.T.

In Science, the children will learn how to identify and name a variety of common materials and properties and everyday materials,

In Geography, the children will learn how to draw a simple map e.g. of a garden, route map, place in a story. Use a simple compass for directions.

In D.T, the children will make a picture with a moving part (mechanisms).

Mathematics

The children will focus on number, place value and start multiplication and division.

They will:

- Count in 2's, 5's and 10's
- Share out equal groups
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving multiplication and equals signs.
- solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays

RE

Judaism: Why might some people put their trust in God? In this unit we will explore how Jewish people believe they can put their trust in God. They will explore how people such as Noah and Abraham out their trust in God. They will learn about the festival of Sukkot and how this is a time when Jews thank God for looking after them. They will think about how celebrations remind people of important events and beliefs.

PSHE

Who helps keep us safe? Children learn how to stay safe in the sun, outdoors and in school.

Music

Your Imagination

Children will listen and appraise the song imagination. They will describe how the music makes them feel and where the music is set. During the summer the children will go on a music walk outside.

Homework

- Maths: Homework will focus on number facts and is set to consolidate skills taught in class.
